

COMFORT ROUNDS – ROUND 1: "GIVING THE HEART A SOFT LANDING"

-Thich Nhat Hanh, Interrelationship "COMFORT ROUND" (CLINICAL DEF.): A NURSING PROCEDURE WHERE A TEAM OF CAREGIVERS REGULARLY CHECK IN WITH PATIENTS TO PROVIDE CARE AND ASSESS THEIR COMFORT.

"COMFORT ROUNDS" (POETIC DEF.): A SERIES OF GENERATIVE POETRY WORKSHOPS WHERE WE GIVE CARE BACK TO OUR CAREGIVERS AND HOSPITAL STAFF WITH THE GIFT OF OUR WORDS.

"Comfort Rounds": Round 1 is an invitation, an introduction, an open door.

In this first set of prompts, we invite you to explore the concept of comfort and how we can express it on the page.

Start a 5-7 Minute FreeWrite with the following phrase: "I Reach Out and Touch..." *

*If you find yourself getting stuck, repeat this phrase or the last word you wrote; keep the pen moving and see where it leads you



IF COMFORT...

- Is:
 - an ANIMAL, what would it be?
 - a SEASON, which would it be?
 - a COLOR, what would it be?
 - a FOOD, what would it be?
- Has:
 - a TEXTURE, what would it feel like?
 - a SCENT, what would it smell like?

PROMPT:

With these questions in mind, paint a picture of Comfort using as few or as many of your answers as you would like





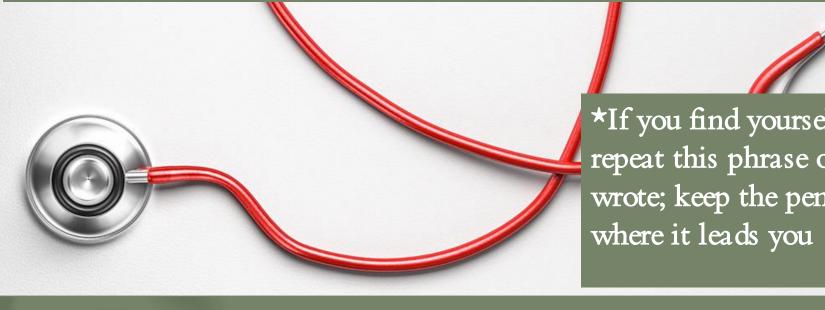


Comfort Rounds: Round 2 – "Portraits Of Kindness"

Set up your easel, lay out your brushes, and fill your metaphorical palette; this series of prompts plays with painting on the canvas of the mind.



Start a 5-7 Minute FreeWrite with the phrase, "A soft voice. A warm gaze. A feather touch..." *



*If you find yourself getting stuck, repeat this phrase or the last word you wrote; keep the pen moving and see where it leads you



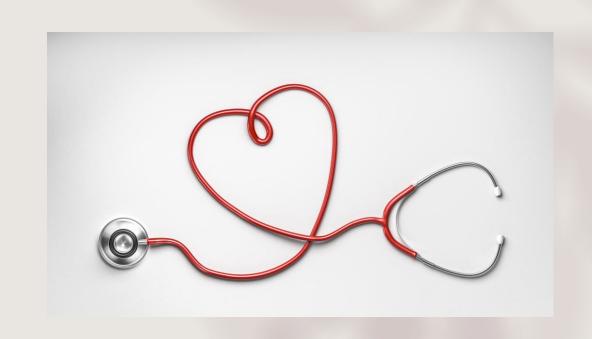
Think about a hospital experience...

Was it joyful or difficult?

Was there a Healthcare Worker who was there for you (a nurse, a doctor, a transporter, caregiver, the assistant who delivered your meal)?

How were they there for you?

What about them brought you comfort?





Consider capturing their:

- -Countenance
- -Expressions
- -How they made you feel- is there a metaphor you could use?

Think about painting styles:

- -Impressionism
- -Expressionism
- -Pointillist
- -Abstract
- -Surreal

1st Line/Repeated Phrase (anaphora):

"When I picture you, I see..."

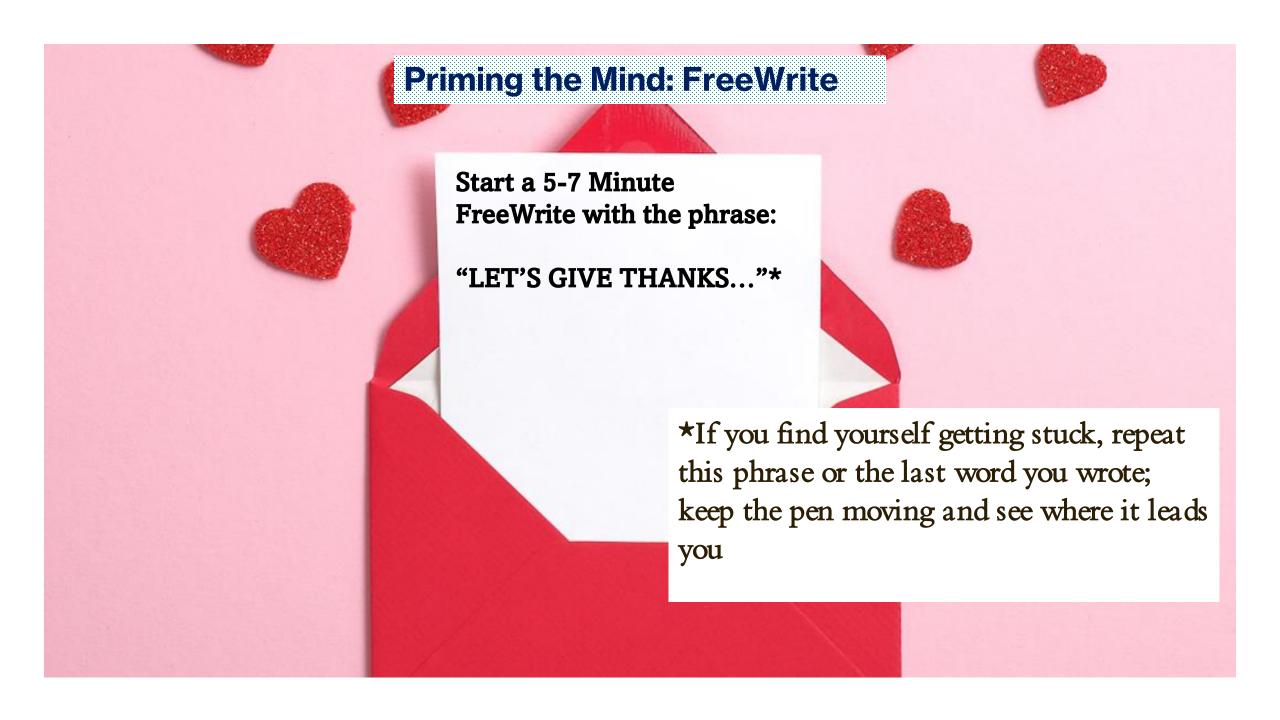




Comfort Rounds: Round 3 "Greeting Card Gratitudes"

A series of Short Forms that leap off the page and into the heart!





"Wait a minute, Postperson!": Playing with Postcard Poems



Opening: Addresses who the card is for (ie: "Dear — ,)

Body: Prose poem of not more than 36 words

Ways to Play:

Imagery: Go VIVID!

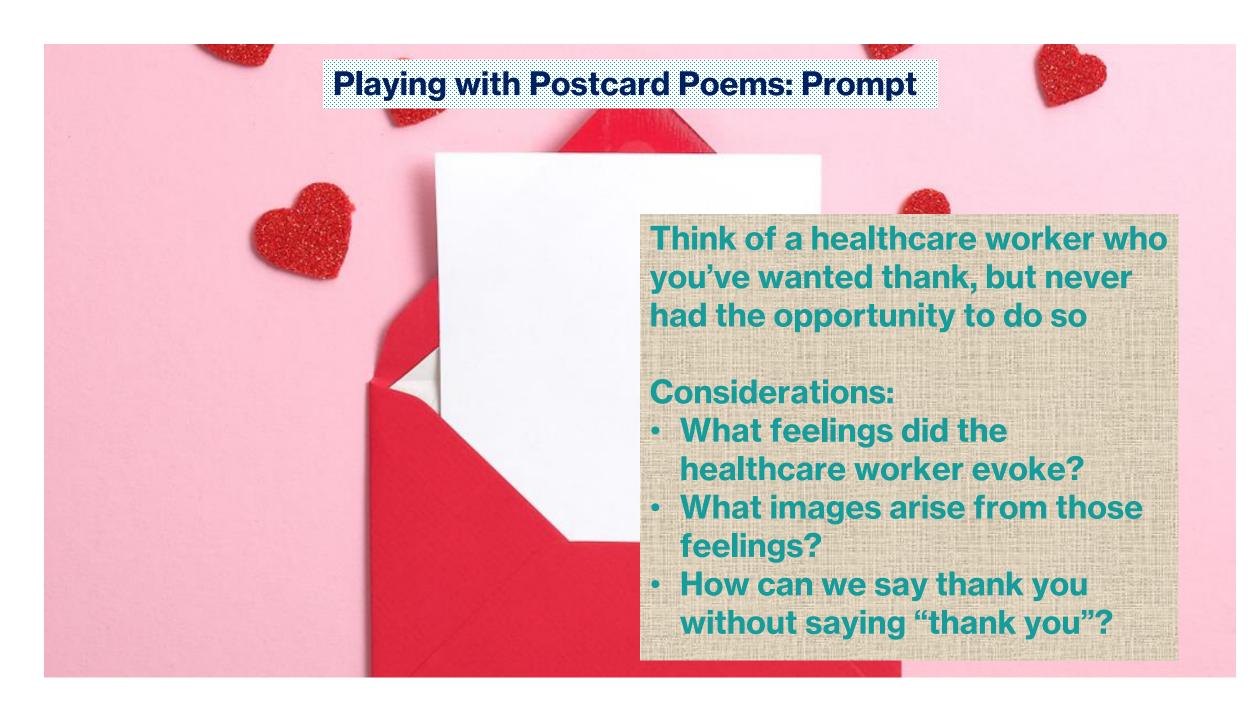
Shape:

Instead of a text block, try staggered lines, split the poem into stanzas, stagger the stanzas, and so on and so on....

Fun Challenge!

Write poem as a Cinquain:

5-line poem with a syllable-per-line count of 2-4-6-8-2









Ways to Play:

-use medical abbreviations

-consider what a "medicine" might be and how it could be

"taken"



Choose another situation where a healthcare worker could experience stress and write a heartfelt message to them



"Lean on me"
"You are not alone"
"You are so strong"
